Trooper Smith was in the Senior Cadet Service in 1911 training area 80C in Gawler SA & the Citizens Military Forces 79th Infantry from the 22nd of February 1912 through to the 30th of June 1915 where he was moved to B Squadron – No 303. He joined the 23rd Australian Light Horse AMF Unit C Squadron on the 30th of June 1916, from here he enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force on the 29th of September 1916. He was allotted number 3135 and was taken on strength on the 4th of October 1916 serving with the 3rd Light Horse 24th reinforcement.

Tpr Smith embarked Adelaide on the ship HMAT "Clan MacCorquodale" on the 5th of February 1917 and disembarked the 12th of March 1917 in Suez where he was marched into isolation Camp Moascar. He was taken on strength on the 26th of March 1917 and joined the 1st Light Horse Training Regiment. On the 26th of May 1917 Pte Smith rejoined the 1st Light Horse Training Regiment from the School of Instruction where on the 5th of June 1917 he transferred to the 3rd Light Horse Regiment and was taken on strength on the 9th of June 1917.

During his time of active service he saw action in Palestine 26^{th} March -31^{st} October 1918 Beersheeba 27^{th} October -7^{th} November 1917

ACTING SERGEANT ALFRED JOSEPH SMITH 4 LINES OF COMMUNICATION SIGNALS (PMG) SERVICE NUMBER: \$41511

Acting Sergeant Alfred Smith enlisted at Kensington SA on the 11th of June 1942.

He was allotted the service of S41511 and was taken on strength for part time duty on the 16th of June 1942 serving with the 4 Australian Line of Communications Signals, which was raised in May of 1942 with the rank of Signaller.

Acting Sergeant Alfred Smith was promoted to T Corporal on the 16th of July 1942

Promoted to Acting Sergeant on the 4th of August 1942.

Acting Sergeant Alfred Smith died at work in service on the 1st of April 1945.

He served for: Total effective period of 1021 days

During this time, his Army records indicate that he attended home training for 15 full days but was in full time service with his Unit which itself was incorporated within the PMG for the duration of the War.
